There Is A Shepherd / Sheep Theme Throughout The Bible

- I. **A unique relationship**
 - A. Some shepherds mentioned
 - 1. Abel
 - 2. Moses
 - 3. David
 - 4. Jesus
 - B. We are called sheep (metaphorically)
 - 1. Prone to wander/get lost
 - 2. Can't see far
 - 3. Prone to get into trouble
 - 4. Need constant care
 - 5. Defenseless against enemies
 - 6. Need to be led
 - 7. Not very smart
 - C. Sheep will perish, without shepherd

- II. **We need a shepherd to keep us from darkness, destruction, (eternal) death. Why?**
 - A. We will go astray
 - B. We follow the wrong path
 - C. We can't see very far
 - D. We do some stupid things
 - E. We are defenseless against wolves

- III. **How do we make it through life (journey) successfully, with purpose and joy**
 - A. We recognize the Lord Jesus is my shepherd
 - B. With Him I am content, I have it made, I am where I need to be
 - C. How does that happen? (He makes me lie down in green pastures)
 - 1. Otherwise, I will burn out
 - 2. I will stress out
 - 3. I will freak out
 - 4. I will worry myself until paranoia takes over
 - D. He leads me beside still waters
 - 1. Opens/closes doors
 - 2. Brings people into our lives
 - 3. Spirit of God, GPS...

- E. He restores my soul
 - 1. Depression
 - 2. Anxiety
 - 3. Fear
 - 4. DoubtWill take over when soul is weak
- F. He is with us in the valley of the shadow of death
 - 1. Darkness
 - 2. Evil
 - 3. Oppression
 - 4. When we should be afraid, He is with us

IV. He prepares a table before me in the presence of my enemies

 - 2. Predictable
 - 3. Remarkable
- D. Jesus prepared a table to bless us and to be a light to those in darkness
 - 1. That's your purpose
 - 2. That's what brings blessings

VI. We have an appetite for darkness

- A. We are in love with sin
- B. Sin is what kills us

- C. But when we eat at His table
 - 1. Drink living water
 - 2. Eat bread of life
 - 3. We have grace and light

- C. I want to point more people to Jesus
- D. I want to shine light into darkness
