DO AS I SAY, NOT AS I DO BY DAVID ORGES



The Tv show *Kids Say the Darndest Things* aired from January 9, 1998 to Jun 23, 2000, and was a spin off of a segment on Art Linkletter's radio program *House Party* that lasted from 1945 to 1969. For decades audiences enjoyed listening to the cute responses of children between the ages 3 and 8 as they were asked basic questions. Their responses were usually humorous and often embarrassing to their parents sitting in the audience. Everyone knew those sweet little kids were repeating what they'd heard their parents say. I don't know if you've ever been in that situation before, but it's not as funny in real life as it is watching it happen to somebody else on TV!

Kids aren't trying to make their parents look bad, they're just doing what they've seen done. It's a principle called modeling.

Modeling is the principle where what you do and say in your authentic actions, how you live and respond in your daily life, is passed on to those that are under your care and authority. It's those words and actions that communicate what you truly believe to those that are watching you. What you tell someone to do, or how you tell them to behave, will never outweigh what they have seen you model for them as appropriate. It's why the best leaders work the hardest, are the most passionate, and set the highest standards. But what about parents? Isn't your home where you're supposed to be able to let your hair down, relax your guard and just be yourself?

In short, yes and no. Yes in the sense that you should be yourself in your home. No in the sense that you and I are pretty consistent sinners that don't set a good example. The good news is that the closer you grow in your relationship with Jesus, the more you're transformed into his likeness, and the more Christ like your modeling will be. Not to mention you'll model what it looks like to pursue a growing relationship with Jesus.

Here's what we know:

Modeling is an important tool for teaching. "Do as I say, not as I do" doesn't fly for you, and it won't fly when it comes to your kids either.

Modeling is exponentially more effective than simple instruction. There is no better way to transfer core beliefs and values than through your unfiltered words and authentic actions.

What we experience impacts us more than what we are told. Instruction is valuable, but experience has the teeth that gain traction and shape our foundations.

So what should you focus on modeling in your home? Start with the foundational building block of the family, and society; show your kids how to love others through the way you love your spouse. Check out Ephesians 5: 21-33. In just 13 short verses, God gives us what pastors, psychologist, and old married couples all agree are the bedrock principles of a good relationship.

Love, Respect, and Mutual Submission.

If you model those three simple principles in how you treat your spouse, you'll actively be teaching your kids what it looks like to have a healthy, God honoring relationship with others, their eventual spouse, and with God. Draw near to God. Love, respect, and submit to your spouse. Your kids will (at least eventually) do what you do, but not necessarily what you say. What will you model for them?

In James 2 beginning in verse 14 it states, "What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead." James 2:14-17. So, how are we doing? Are we living our lives to serve ourselves or serve our Father in heaven? When people think of us, will they think, "Man, I can see Jesus through them". Or "yeah they go to church, but just to say they went". If you are reading this, then God has given you another day, let's leave a legacy where people would be lying if they were to say we are not followers of Jesus.

GOD'S MONEY AND YOU BY JIM OTKEN



February - the month most closely associated with love due to Valentine's Day. Scripture speaks very often of love. In fact, the Bible makes it clear in 1 John 4:8, that "The one who does not love does not know God, for God is love."

So, God has called you and me to love. To love one another as Christ loves the church. However, Scripture also cautions us about love. More specifically, one particular warning is about the love of money. This is one of the most misquoted verses of the Bible. Money is not the root of all evil, but the love of money is.

1 Timothy 6:10 states, "For the love of money is the root of all sorts of evil, and some by longing for it have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs."

I have seen many people led astray by the pursuit of money. And in the early stages of my career, even I chased money. It was an endless chase with no satisfaction. God has since enlightened me, and through the study of His Word, I now view money

entirely different than I used to.

In fact, my studies have lead me to a simple 3 step approach to money: God, Save, Live. The first fruits of labor are returned cheerfully to God to further His Kingdom. The Gospel is free, but bringing it to people costs money. I know some people like to argue Old Testament vs. New Testament or tithe vs. cheerful giving. The fact is that Scripture does not contradict itself. We are instructed to support in a financial way and to be cheerful about it.



Note that saving and living take place after giving to the cause of Christ. Malachi 3:10, the Lord says to "test Me in this." So the test is to faithfully give to the

Lord and wait for the abundant blessings He will provide in your life.

Be encouraged, trust God in all areas of your life, and ask Him for guidance in your support of Live Oak.

Volunteering, it's a concept we often hear about in church, and one we, ministry leaders, don't always explain the significance of. Without volunteers, Student Ministry would not be able to exist in our current state. For reference, in Focal Point, we have an average of 50 students on Wednesday nights. With just me it would be 50:1, that would make for some interesting services for sure. Gladly, this is not the case though. Focal Point has roughly 15 volunteers on a weekly basis dropping our ratio close to a healthy 3:1. I believe this is why our ministry functions so well, and has almost doubled in size in the last 5 months. Our students learn best on a smaller scale.

I love being able to preach on a weekly basis and dig through scripture as a group, but the deeper learning, the application, the true growth takes place in our smaller discussion groups. Being able to ask questions and scour the scriptures and our life experiences for an answer isn't something done efficiently from stage in front of a crowd. However, it is something a couple of volunteers can do with 10 students around a table. This is why our students love being here on Wednesday nights.

While I love my small group leaders and what they do for Focal Point week in and week out, they aren't the only volunteers here on Wednesday nights. We also have volunteers to run our computers and lights. They make sure lyrics are on the screen for our congregation to worship, and the lights are on while our speaker is up front. Our band is also comprised almost completely of volunteers. Every Wednesday night our high-school students are able to come to service and worship with their leaders and peers because of the time our band dedicates to leading them. It is an amazing thing to sit back and listen to 60 people sing to our savior, declaring their love for him.

So to all my volunteers, past and present, thank you for everything you have ever done. Students lives are changed on a weekly basis because of what you have done and continue to do. To anybody who isn't currently volunteering in the church, feel free to come check us out on Wednesday nights 6-8. We would love to have you participate in what we are doing here at Live Oak Church.
