
IRISTMAS WITH PURPOSE BY TRENT BARNETT

First, I have an abundance of joy over the decades of ministry that has occurred through our faithful Thrift Store volunteers. They have touched many lives. Many of those were the less fortunate of our community providing clothes and a variety of other items. Early on, the Thrift Store provided much needed funds to support Live Oak Church during difficult times. As the church began to grow the Thrift Store continued to support various ministries of our church including the Benevolence Ministry and Funeral Food Ministry, just to name a couple. Over the years our Thrift Store Ministry has supported Pregnancy Centers, Addiction Recovery Centers, Women's Shelters, Toy Drives and much more. What an awesome ministry of giving this ministry has been through the years! How appropriate to recognize this ministry during this season of giving, Christmas, the time when we celebrate God giving us His Son in Bethlehem's manger.

Second, I feel deep sorrow over the need to close our Thrift Store. Initially, I closed the Thrift Store due to the COVID-19 virus. Many of our volunteers are in the target age of the most vulnerable. Once there was inactivity in the facility a list was provided by our volunteers of items that needed repair. In the process of getting things repaired it was discovered that the building had some issues that made it unsafe. As a result, our Trustees, who are responsible for oversight of our property and facilities researched the situation and closed the building until a solution can be found. My sorrow over the necessary closure of this building is for our community who became accustomed to looking to us. My sorrow is also for our volunteeers, who for years have selflessly given of their time to this ministry and now, due to circumstances beyond our control, must be closed because it is the responsible thing to do to protect our volunteers and our community.

I am grateful to Peggy Langois, who directed our Thrift Store for 25 years and all the volunteers who served with her. May God richly bless you as we celebrate Jesus this Christmas season and seek His direction for the future of this ministry and His future purpose for our lives.
