

SERENITY IN TIMES OF UNCERTAINTY BY DAVID ORGES



ave you ever played a game with a little kid? Maybe you've been around a group of little kids playing a game. It's only a matter of time until at least one kid starts losing and immediately tries to change the rules. The post that was "base" is no longer base when they can't tag anybody. They can suddenly play all of your draw two cards when you call Uno. The kid that finishes dinner first suddenly loses because the winner was really the kid that finished last the whole time. With the schools closed and the Governor's stay at home order, my entire life feels like a million combinations of scenario that sound a lot like that. My kids are 6, 5, & 3. All of life is a struggle for control, and I haven't even started talking about the parent child dynamic. We got three little pirates on the verge of mutiny at any moment!

In times of uncertainty, the natural response inside of every one of us is to grasp for something, anything, that we can control. It's why people hoard toilet paper when a virus has no symptoms that would require toilet paper. It's why people obsess over the minute by minute news updates.

It's why people practice civil disobedience. We're all searching for something we can control in a time that makes us feel out of control. The theologian Reinhold Niebuhr wrote one of the most well known prayers ever written. You probably know it as the Serenity Prayer:

God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference. Living one day at a time, enjoying one moment at a time; accepting hardship as a pathway to peace; taking, as Jesus did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it; trusting that You will make all things right if I surrender to Your will; so that I may be reasonably happy in this life and supremely happy with You forever in the next. Amen.

The prayer is so incredibly powerful. It has resonated with millions of people because of the beautifully written simple truth that we all need to be reminded of: There are things that we cannot control. Our hope comes in knowing that God is in control. God is never caught off guard. He is never unprepared. He is never overwhelmed. He is never out of control.

I can't tell you that I always know the mind of God. I won't even tell you there aren't times when I question how God could possibly be in control, when the circumstances seem to suggest that nobody is in control. But that's when we trust what we know to be true, not just what feels true in the moment.

God is the creator and sustainer of all things. God is aware of your circumstances. God is in control.

When that doesn't feel true, ask God to grant you the serenity to accept the things you cannot change, the courage to change the things you can, and the wisdom to know the difference.

WORSHIP IN THE CHAOS BY TRENT BARNETT

LIVE OAK WORSHIP

here's a line to a worship song that has been running in my head for the past couple weeks. The Coronavirus has made for an especially uncertain time in our world, leading to a ton of confusion and chaos - hence the lyric (Hillsong United's "None But Jesus")

In the chaos and confusion
I know You're sovereign still
In the moment of my weakness
You give me grace to do Your will

It's safe to say the chaos and confusion of this season are unprecedented. As tough as it may be, many of us know what to expect when hurricanes or floods hit, because we've been through it before. We know how to prepare and what the steps to recovery look like. With this situation, it can be hard to know what even tomorrow will bring or look like.

But we have the promise of Psalm 46 (and countless other truths in God's Word) that, "God is our refuge and strength, an everpresent help in times of trouble." He is still God, and He is still sovereign. And He gives us grace upon grace (John 1:16) to do His will.

So what is God's will - for this season, and for our lives? In Ephesians 5, Paul challenges us to not be foolish, but to understand what the Lord's will is - to be "filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another with psalms,

hymns, and spiritual songs. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord" (v. 18-19). There are so many things I could say just on this verse, but for our present purposes - the best thing we can do in times of trial and difficulty is to worship God. To let our hearts and our mouths overflow with thankfulness and praise, giving all glory to God, and encouraging each other through our

posture of worship.

When Paul and Silas were in jail (Acts 16), it says "about midnight they were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them" (v. 25). A violent earthquake shook the prison, opened the doors, and released everyone's chains. The guard was afraid the prisoners would have all escaped, but was amazed to find everyone was still there.

Just before disaster struck, Paul & Silas were worshiping in the middle of a difficult, uncertain situation. When circumstances became even worse, Paul & Silas could have escaped, but instead they remained faithful. The posture of their hearts toward worship, even in difficulty, led to the jailer and his whole family being saved!



So, when the chaos and confusion of life sets in, we have a few options. We can look for an escape. We can collapse in fear. Or, we can trust God's faithfulness and be found worshipping. What do you want to be found doing?


A DIFFERENT WAY OF DOING MINISTRY




