- A. The pain it causes
- B. The ripple effect (causation)
- C. The confusion
- D. The consequences

II. How evil/darkness/sin work in our lives

- Evil is rebellion to what God has declared
- B. Doesn't impact just one person, it impacts everyone you know
- C. Its impact gets worse with each generation

III. Different realities of evil

- A. The evil in our world due to the fallen condition of our world
 - 1. There was a time when the world was perfect
 - 2. Sin, rebellion entered the world
 - 3. Evil entered the world
 - 4. The result viruses, volcanoes, diseases, destruction, hurricanes and heartache (God declared this would happen)
- B. There is a moral evil
 - 1. Evil in our heart
 - 2. Evil in our behavior
 - 3. Evil toward others (we do evil things)
- C. There is a supernatural evil
 - 1. A demonic spiritual evil, that hates you, and seeks to destroy you
 - 2. Satan usurped humanity and created a false religious system
 - 3. The evil of Hell
 - 4. Evil is present, powerful, pervasive, everywhere in every one

IV. The reality of God

- A. Many say "there is no God due to the evil in the world" (The Philosophical problem with that statement)
 - 1. When you say there is evil you say there is good

- 2. When you say there is good you are saying there is a moral law distinguishing good and evil
- 3. If there is a moral law, must be a moral law giver
- B. God is creator of all natural-physical laws and He is revealed in scripture
 - 1. He controls the elements through physical laws
 - 2. He has a plan to restore the world
 - 3. His plan to renew and redeem the world and humanity

V. What God does with evil/sin - (10 things)

- A. He exposes it for what it is
 - 1. The destruction it causes
 - 2. The death it causes
 - 3. The darkness it causes
 - 4. The dominion it creates
 - 5. The demonic that plans it
- B. He paid the price so we can be forgiven
 - 1. Though we are the ones who are rebellious, Jesus pays for our sin/rebellion
 - 2. II Corinthians 5:21
 - 3. Jesus died, among evil humanity in a world that went dark
- C. He created a place called Hell to punish it... (Hell is a place to punish evil)
- D. He allows us to walk in grace and not shame and guilt as believers in Jesus
- E. He returns to make all things new (Revelation 19:11)
- ${\sf F.} \qquad {\sf He fills us with His Spirit giving us the gifts to help others out of darkness into light}$
 - 1. Like the heroes of the Titanic
- G. He creates a place called New Heaven and New Earth where evil will never happen
- H. A place of redemption and reward to get back what evil took
- I. A place of reunion of relationships
- J. All done with His plan and timing

VI. The future of evil

- A. It loses to Jesus and His cross and resurrection
- B. It is destroyed (one day) forever as Jesus returns
- C. Never to be seen again in New Heaven and New Earth
